
They followed this by working on a project with Angie. The pupils enjoyed exploring the use and manipulation of clay and making model animals for the school farm.

We have been enjoying our new friends and changes to our classroom environment – the hammock has been a big hit! This term, we have been investigating colours with our sensory story "The Story of the Rainbow" (An Indian legend) which has provided lots of opportunities to get messy and have fun playing together.

After half term, we moved on to our second story "Pick a Pine Tree" where we learned about decorating for Christmas. This story finished with a trip to a Christmas Adventure at Stockeld Park in Wetherby where we picked our own real pine tree for class and enjoyed the woodland walk with sounds, lights and sculptures to interact with. We brought our tree back to class and had lots of fun decorating it as we had practiced through the sensory story © We enjoyed showing our video at the Christmas concert too! We have also been enjoying TacPac which has helped us to develop appropriate touch, Rhyme time where we explore sensory poetry and rhymes, and Playing with Sounds where we have fun making different speech sounds and doing crafts and sensory activities.

A1 - Key Stages 4/5

This term our project work has been 'The Repair Shop' We have looked at a variety of activities with the idea of repairing electrical equipment and using electrical equipment safely in the kitchen and in a home situation. The students work in three groups in the sixth form with a curriculum that is suited to their needs.

Our pupils have planned their own visits this term, with Group 2 going to Xscape and playing 3D golf, the whole of 6th form out to the Cinema in relation to our positive relationships and friends work and Group 3 have visited many different restaurants and shopping outlets.

Some of the events that the pupils organised included Macmillan coffee morning, the Halloween party and a special afternoon tea party for B&Q staff who over the summer painted the entire school.

We have also been working hard on planning for our future and looking at different roles within the community. Our Employment pathway pupils have been out on many industrial visits to look at the different career paths that are open to them when they leave Coppice School. These have included King Asia factory and Army cooks and taster sessions.

Some pupils completed a Wicks carpentry day, building new benches for the lower school sensory outdoor area. All of our students have enjoyed preparing and cooking their own lunches once a week, working towards their independence skills.

Our pupils have had different work placements over the term, including our local Library Games Morning to working at the local Care home as a care assistant. These work placements will continue with other pupils next term.
