We've had some changes in class this term. Tracey has moved to her confirmed role as Deputy Head so Catherine has taken over as full-time teacher in Willow. We have reorganised our teaching timetable to build in opportunities for learning through physical activities and real-life learning as well as the more structured learning challenges.

We have had lots of fun exploring our Sensory Circuit every morning, learning about speech with Playing with Sounds and exploring our sensory story. This half term it has been "Jack Frost" and we've had fun making marks on cold 'windows' and throwing fake snowballs at each other. It has been lovely to get to know all the students and have fun together

PE is currently on a Monday and Thursday – indoor and outdoor kit is required. Forest School is on a Thursday – wellies, gloves, hats and scarves are advised.

Our topic this term has been Reduce, Reuse and Recycle! Rowan class have loved the book 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley'. We had lots of fun creating a sensory story and made our own kites out of recycled items. We explored the different sea creatures in the story and looked at the importance of recycling our rubbish.

In our project lessons we have made our own reusable bags, exploring different materials and the different ways we can stick and sew them together. We created and designed our own logos using different media and ICT programs. We have added our own designs focusing on different colours and shapes. In PE we developed our ball skills, while also focusing on turn taking, sharing and working as part of a team. This half term we have been developing our gymnastics skills learning how to roll and travel on, off and over small apparatus. We have recently experienced some Diwali celebrations, tasting different foods and loved making our own Diwali lanterns.

Pupils loved testing materials and experimenting with changing textures. They were brilliant at sorting rubbish into different bins! We were working on improving our problem solving skills when making objects and games from recycling materials. Pupils made stilts from giant tins, an animal themed bowling game, recycled car track, building blocks, Green Pigs can slam, a sensory walk (giant feet with various textures) and various types of boats. Pupils practiced their knowledge of textures and materials while completing activities linked to our very popular English story "The Story of the Little Mole Who Knew it was None of His Business". Pupils made different types of poos, recognised animals through pictures, plastic figurines, symbols, signs and sounds. They also were working on improving describing pictures in the story through matching photos and symbols. Some of the pupils learnt parts of the story!! Our new story is "The Jolly Postman, or, other people's letters

This term Hazel have been looking at packaging and re-using our rubbish. We have had lots of fun in science making lava lamps and 'exploding' fountains using mentos, fizzy pop and different plastic bottles. We learnt about textures and explored different materials through our story 'The Mole Who Knew That It Was None Of His Business'.

This half term we have looked at the stories about the Jolly Postman and have been giants, finding tiny words and pictures, we made different types of porridge and

have been looking at letters to Father Christmas. The children have enjoyed music therapy and have joined in and responded really positively to our 'Playing with Sounds' sessions.

Next term our topic will be 'School of Rock' and we will be exploring and making sounds in different ways, looking at different types of music and continuing to learn through exploration and practical activities.

Holly

This term Holly class have been having lots of fun junk modelling and carrying out science experiments. All pupils worked really hard building a volcano sculpture and mixing ingredients to make it erupt. We learnt about different materials through our story 'Someone Swallowed Stanley' and did lots of number work, even learning some of our timetables. In Autumn 2 we read the story 'The Jolly Christmas Postman'. We wrote and posted our own Christmas cards, made a board game in Maths and paper mache Santa sacks. In September we also started learning about road safety. This is an area which we will be focusing on

all year so we can learn how to be safe in the community.

PE kits are needed every Tuesday please. These will be sent home on a weekly basis to be washed. Pupils in J1 also need slippers to wear in class and wellies to use during outdoor learning.

J1

J1 have had a great first term to the year! We have really enjoyed our topic Pinocchio and have developed our performance and speaking skills, writing our own scripts and performing these.

As part of these performances, we have developed our measure and number skills, designing and building our own puppets. We have worked really had to build and develop friendships and as a whole class we have made great steps towards being a 'good friend'. This term, we have also being learning about what mental health is and what the term 'lonely' means and what we can do to help ourselves and others if they feel lonely. Through our topic Pinocchio, we have been learning about recycling and how toy production has changed over the years.

We made our own mini-landfill to find out how different materials decompose and have recycled clothing to make Christmas decorations for enterprise. We have also upcycled old keys and CDs to make spinners and wind chimes for our outdoor areas. We have developed our science skills and enjoyed making slime, creating art with soap and investigating what happens when you mix different materials

Coppice Farm and Gardens




